



Founders Modern World History Course Supply List:

Lesson: *Project* - Supplies

- 1: Cardstock (colored and white), scissors, glue, pencil, permanent marker, toilet paper rolls, hot glue, acrylic paint (brown), [printable templates with instructions](#) (or make your own).
- 2: A blank world map, a pencil and colored pencils.
- 3: An apple, celery stalk, crackers (like Wheat Thins), and yogurt
- 4: Paper tube (paper towel or gift wrap), construction paper, scotch tape and stickers for decorating
- 5: Some optional equipment could be binoculars, a camera, a journal or paper (to make your map), colored pencils, a compass, a backpack and any other exploration equipment!
- 6: [Coloring page](#) (or make your own sailboat), glue, paintbrushes and spices (cinnamon or other milder scents you don't mind smelling for a few days).
- 7: Print [blank map](#), paper, tea bag, markers, and oil
- 8: Optional: Large cardboard box (to make a ship), paints (to paint your ship), brooms (to use as oars), and [toy rats](#)
- 9: An assortment of legos
- 10: 2 pieces of cardstock, electrical tape and two lenses: [1 double concave lens \(150mm\)](#) and [1 double convex lens \(500 mm\)](#) for each student.
- 11: Cardboard, a pencil, scissors, yarn, pipe cleaners, beads, feathers, [bric brac](#)
- 12: A thick piece of [yarn](#) and various [colors of yarn](#).
- 13: A full size bar of [Ivory soap](#), craft sticks and a [dinner knife](#) with adult supervision.
- 14: [Wood shapes](#), a 2x2 pine board (you'll need a miter saw to cut them or they can be purchased [here](#)), paint, a paintbrush and a [wood burning tool](#)
- 15: Cardboard Tube Giraffe: 6 cardboard toilet paper tubes, 2 Sheet giraffe print felt, 1/2 Sheet white felt, 2 Large wiggle eyes, masking tape, white craft glue or felt glue, jumbo craft stick, a scissors, 24" white yarn and a hot glue gun
Handprint Giraffe: Colored cardstock or construction paper, a scissors, a glue stick, markers a pencil, a [giraffe template](#) (enter your email in the form at the end of this post to have the link sent to you) or make your own.
- 17: [air drying clay](#) or [clay](#), [pattern](#), colored pencils, [Modge Podge](#), rolling pin, waxed paper, ruler, sharp knife (with adult supervision), paint brushes and an emery board or sand paper
- 18: Sculpture: [air drying clay](#) or [clay](#) (hopefully, you have some clay left from Day 17).
Draw a Picture: Paper, a pencil, paintbrush and paints.
- 19: Paper, a pencil, paintbrush and paints.
- 20: Paper, crayons and a Sharpie marker
- 21: Options for this day include: A [Recorder](#); [Duolingo](#) (for learning a language); To make a boffer - bamboo stick, foam insulation tubes, duct tape and hockey tape, a hot glue gun and glue sticks with adult supervision and a box cutter and blade sharpener.
- 22: [Template to make clock](#), a scissors and [magnetic tape strips](#)
- 24: Candy (candy corn/small things) or crackers; picture of [Martin Luther](#) and [Germany map](#); paper towel rolls; paper and pencils; gummi worms.
- 26: [Template of a crown](#), gems, glue, color crayons or colored pencils, or markers, a scissors
- 27: Five Solas: [Five Solas](#), painters tape and a [soft kids hammer](#). Diet of Worms: Gummy Bears and paper plates
- 28: [Feathers](#), paint and paper



- 29: [Contact paper](#), tissue paper and the [Cross template](#) (or a different one as student desires).
- 30: Recycled materials from around your house like: popsicle sticks, plastic bottles, plastic silverware, plastic containers, paper plates, styrofoam cups, glue (the website has many more ideas for recycled materials too).
- 31: [Nerf gun](#)
- 32: Paper cups, colored paper, scotch tape, a scissors, a ruler, a pencil, hot glue gun, and a rubber band
- 33: Brown construction paper, a cape, coat or a throw blanket, and a play sword/pool noodles, wrapping paper cardboard tube, or sticks (optional).
- 34: Pool noodles, wrapping paper cardboard tube, sticks or other play sword
- 36: [Script of choice](#)
- 37: [Beads](#) (of various sizes/colors), [letter beads](#), [stretchy string](#), [crimping beads](#), [crimping tool](#)
- 38: Favorite Bible verse (written or printed out), colored pencils, crayons, paint, paint pens or any other embellishments for the page.
- 39: King Charles Broad-Brimmed Hat: 2 sheets of thick paper of the same color, glue, scissors, pencil and yarn. Oliver Cromwell's Tall Crown Hat: Hat Template, heavy paper (like poster board or cardstock), crepe paper (or you can also use tissue paper for the big flowers), ribbon, string (or wire), a scissors, an X-acto knife (with adult supervision) and a stapler.
- 41: [A World Map](#) (printed 3x3, colored and then laminated), colored pencils, variety of legos, a [vis-a-vis marker](#), a glue stick and a scissors
- 42: 2 liter soda bottle, plastic bendy straws – 4 or so, hot glue, balloon – we used a 9 inch balloon, but a smaller one will also work, a container for catching the water, food coloring (optional), drill or something to make a hole in the plastic bottle
- 43: [Unfinished wood cross](#), chalk paint, hot glue (with adult supervision), broken glass pieces (or rhinestones, floral pebbles or any embellishment you'd like).
- 44: A variety of legos
- 45: Watercolor paper, watercolor paints, black card and glue
- 46: All-purpose flour, salt, baking powder, milk, egg, melted unsalted butter. A stove top or hot plate is needed to make the pancakes.
- 47: Pool Noodles
- 48: [Hand Coffee Grinder](#) or [Mortar and Pestle](#), [Hard Red Winter Wheat Berries](#)
- 49: Plastic spoon, salt, pepper, a wool product (like socks or a scarf), measuring spoons and a paper plate
- 50: [Print map of the 13 colonies](#), colored pencils or crayons
- 51: Red, white and blue paint, and paintbrushes
- 52: Sticks, twigs, leaves, rocks, branches from evergreen trees, construction paper, tape, foamboard and glue
- 53: A thick stick with a [notch](#) in it, a knife (with adult supervision), another couple of sticks, [cord](#), [spring pole](#).
- 54: 1/2 inch diameter PVC pipe. You will need 27 inches for each gun, although this doesn't need to be exact. A little more or less will be fine, two t-shaped joints, two elbow joints and two caps. Make sure none of the joint pieces have threading inside them.
- 55: Items to sell in a trading post: silk or cotton clothing, ivory, dyes, spices and anything else students think of to "sell" in their post and some play money or perhaps you could have students barter their merchandise!
- 56: White plate (Dollar Tree), [oil based marker](#), dry erase marker, rubbing alcohol/cloth, an oven is needed for this project.
- 57: [Origami paper](#) or printer paper (must be cut to be a square)
- 58: For soup: Chicken or vegetable broth, soy sauce, fresh ginger, bok choy or Napa cabbage, mushrooms, carrots, tofu, ramen noodles, scallions, a lime, cilantro, mint or basil, and oranges
- For WoodBlock Printing: Styrofoam Meat Tray (ask butcher for clean ones), paint, paint roller or brush, a pen and a scissors
- 59: Computer, phone or other device to search online, [Challenge Cards \(PDF\)](#) or 10-12 small pieces of paper to make your own, a scissors, markers or crayons, a large paper bag, a variety of recycled materials such as plastic bottles, paper tubes, bottle caps, milk jugs, newspapers, paper or plastic cups, food containers, popsicle



- sticks, paper, etc., a variety of craft materials such as paper clips, rubber bands, pom poms, pipe cleaners, stickers, coffee filters, string, beads, pasta, straws, plastic wrap, etc., tape, glue
- 60: [Map of the East Indies](#), colored pencils or crayons and/or pictures of rice, pepper, sugar, cloves, nutmeg, ivory, diamonds, tin and precious woods.
- 61: Large cardboard boxes, tape and mirrors (as many as you can find).
- 62: Whatever equipment is needed to play a favorite sport!
- 63: 2 (3.4-ounce) boxes of instant French Vanilla pudding, whole milk, Cool Whip, cinnamon graham crackers and a tub of dark chocolate fudge frosting
- 65: [Map of France](#) (scroll about ¼ of the way down the website and right click the image), [watercolor paints](#), a paintbrush and a glass of water.
- 66: Acrylic Paint, cotton Q-tips and aluminum foil
- 67: [Glycerine soap base](#), [soap coloring](#), [soap fragrance oils](#) and [soap molds](#)
- 68: Contact paper, tissue paper or crepe paper, a scissor and [black construction paper](#) and Elmers glue
- 69: To make vanilla pound cake from scratch: unsalted butter, cream cheese, salt, sugar, baking powder, vanilla extract, almond extract, eggs, milk and all-purpose flour. For the inside of the sandwich: Hershey's chocolate bar (or any chocolate bar with rectangles) and a frying pan to make the grilled sandwich.
- 70: Winter gear (hats, boots, mittens, coats, etc), play swords (a big stick will even work), and any other ideas for a pretend battle.
- 71: [Gold Candy Coins](#)
- 73: Maps of [Central](#) and [South America](#), watercolor paints, a paintbrush and water to color.
- 74: 9×12 black paper, [chalk pastels](#), [oil pastels](#) {to outline}, pictures of Amazon animals (printed off Google) and LOTS of baby wipes
- 75: 4 different types of fruit (we used pineapple, orange, kiwi and strawberry), a sharp knife and chopping board (adult supervision required), bamboo sticks, a scissors and natural yogurt
- 76: Popsicle sticks (you can color them!), rubber bands, toothpick or matchstick, paper, scissors and a pencil
- 77: Name That Tune: Favorite songs (this can be done from a Spotify list or YouTube clips). Musical Chairs: Chairs and music
- 78: Set of Glasses of equal shape and size, water, metal spoon and food coloring (optional)
- 79: A sled, wagon or suitcase filled with books or other heavy items, and an outside hill
- 80: Tunnel (from Day 61), and yarn (or shoelaces would work too).
- 81: For City Skyline: City Skyline on white paper, black marker, oil pastels and Q tips (cotton buds). For Lego City: Lots of legos!
- 83: [First Aid Kit](#), lamp (flashlight works just fine)
- 84: Newspaper (check with your local library and ask for as much old newspaper as they'll give you), a big cardboard box to put all the paper in, empty cereal boxes, paper, and any other "clean" garbage, some fun "finds" for students like candy, granola bars, etc.
- 85: Printable template (see bottom of website. If you give them your email you can get a free template, or just make your own hearts from brown cardstock), tan cardstock, a scissors, glitter glue or [puffy paint](#), craft glue, embellishments like rick rack and buttons, yarn or ribbon, and a hole punch
- 87: Alpine Hat: Elastic, craft glue, clip, hole punch, a scissors, decorations (any embellishments will do) and construction paper OR Apple Strudel: 1 medium Granny Smith, brown sugar, raisins, all purpose flour, frozen puff pastry, salt, egg, whole milk
- 88: Shoebox, embellishments for decorating the box and three desserts and three animals to cast your vote for.
- 89: [Ticket to Ride Board Game](#)
- 90: [Printed morse code page](#)
- 91: 2 identical food containers, paper, tape, 100 pennies in a bag, and a pencil
- 93: For Edible Slime: A microwave is needed for this project. Jumbo marshmallows, powdered sugar, and Instant Chocolate Pudding Mix (Powdered). For Non-edible Slime: [White Washable PVA School Glue](#), [Liquid](#)



[Starch](#), a hot chocolate packet, water, a bowl, a spoon, and measuring cups

94: Copy paper

95: Copy paper

96: Empty cylinder-shaped box or can – such as an oatmeal box, salt container, or coffee can – with the top and bottom removed, two heavy cloth squares, cut slightly larger than box top, yarn, white paper, colored pencils, crayons or markers, glue, a pencil or nail, scissors

97: Old magazines to cut apart (tissue paper would also work, glue and scissors)

99: Legos, paper, colored pencils/crayons/paint, wooden blocks or any other supplies as students request.

100: [Printed African map](#), watercolor paints and brush and a glass of water to change colors of paint.

101: Scrap fabric (We used white cotton), gel glue, acrylic paint, cardboard or mat for underneath fabric

102: Copy paper, a scissors and masking tape or purchase a [boomerang](#)

103: brown paper grocery bag, [glycerin](#), water, a small bowl, [oil pastels](#), a [sponge brush](#), small sticks or skewers, a scissors and a glue stick

104: [Pan](#) (you can use a plastic colander as well), [fool's gold](#)

105: [Lasso rope](#)

106: Coffee beans, a couple paint brushes, Mod Podge, two colors of paint, glue gun, a small canvas (6x6) - it's ok to just use construction paper or cardstock too, Elmer's glue and a pencil.

108: Bread: Water, sugar, yeast, flour, egg, salt. An oven is needed for this project. Pretend Bread: [Playdoh](#)

109: Yeast, sugar, warm water, kitchen thermometer, a spoon, a glass jar, a glass drinking bottle (12–16 oz.), a small funnel and a balloon

110: Stone cutouts (template available this website under activity Altar of the Lord's Provision), paper (1 sheet per child, gray and light brown), scissors, glue, disposable cups (1 per child), crayons, pencils, or pens

112: Supplies vary depending upon the food made or purchased.

113: Paper, white crayon and a marker

115: Construction Paper (we used 12 x 18), tissue paper, crepe paper streamers, scissors, glue and a hole punch

116: Legos or wooden blocks

117: [Print in 3x3 the pages to make your map](#), [Vis-a-Vis markers](#), laminate your map, [push pins](#), yarn, [puppets](#), popsicle sticks and glue.

118: Print the various animals that were used in WWI, glue and paper.

121: A cell phone or camera for photo taking

122: Pots (optional), garden soil and seeds.

123: Paper cut to 7x 9 1/8 " for letter writing

124: Flour, raisins, salt, ground cinnamon, ground allspice, powdered sugar for dusting

a mixing bowl, honey, water, shortening like Crisco, baking soda, baking powder, 12 paper cup liners/12 cup cupcake pan and a sauce pan

125: [Print page 2](#)

126: Flower Fingerprints: paper, crayons and an ink stamp or paint. Scavenger Hunt: Possible items are a flower, a leaf, a rock, a stick, a clover, a feather, a cicada shell, etc. Change the list based on what you have around you.

127: Depending upon which method you use to memorize scripture, [print a coloring sheet](#) or use legos or k'nex or just a flashlight to build a memorial.

130: Paper bowl, glue, white foam cubes (sugar cubes work too), scissors and a paper plate

131: Watercolors, a paintbrush and a glass of water (for changing colors)

132: two sheets of 8 1/2 X 11 inch paper (copy, construction, notebook, etc.) and a pair of scissors of 8-10 square post-it notes.

136: Print [map](#), a globe or [Googlemaps](#)

138: [Catan Junior Board Game](#)

141: Wooden blocks or cardboard boxes

142: [Printout of a rocket template](#) (or another one you like), aluminum foil, spray adhesive (I used Elmer's Craft



Bond), newspaper or another surface protector (for spraying the glue), scissors, permanent markers in several colors, or acrylic paint, paint shirt or smock

star-shaped craft punch (optional), glue, black paper and red tissue paper

143: Supplies will vary depending upon the student's invention!
